SOCIAL MEDIA, BLOGS AND WHATSAPP!

Unlike those days when you must be sure of your communication skills and capacity to express yourself rightly in the English language before you can drop any line in

the conventional media platforms, the advent of the Social media technology has polluted that beauty made possible by mainstream media, as it is now an all comers affair via social media platforms.

The most worrisome is the misleading and unsubstantiated news items we read there per second.

Not until about a month ago that Nigeria released a draft guidelines to regulate social media, blogs and online platforms; there has never been any caution to the serial abuse of the media platforms and these become immoral for the partakers.

Now that we are in the political season, as a build up to 2023 general elections, Rotarians are free to be political but we must control our emotions and expressions that stand to erode our code of ethics as ROTARIANS any time we engage in conversations on Social media, WhatsApp, Blogs etc even if there are no regulations with force of law yet in place to curtail such.

A PEEP INTO THE DRAFT Code of Practice to guide the operations of Twitter, Facebook, WhatsApp, Instagram, Google, TikTok, and other social media platforms in the country.

Part of the code, which seeks to regulate social media, states that each of the Platforms operating in Nigeria must provide "any information under its domain or any assistance to any authorized government agency for the purpose of carrying out an investigation, combating cybercrimes, or prosecuting an offense."

The government also wants the social media platforms to abide by Nigerian laws and "not deploy or modify their Platform in any way that will undermine or interfere with the application and/or enforcement of the law."...

This space may not be enough for the entire draft; let's take our time to research further on this.

As we are ruminating over the above, the editorial board hereby regrets the printing quality of our last edition, we apologise and promise an improvement from this edition.



PERSONALITY INTERVIEW



PDG Deinde Shoga is one of the few that qualifies to be called "Mr Rotary" and professionally, the Consultant Surgeon and a University Don is no pushover anywhere.

In this Chat with Gbagada Express, the weekly bulletin of Rotary Club of Gbagada, PDG Deinde Shoga was in his known element to do justice to our inquisitions.

Excerpts.

Gbagada Express : Can we meet you sir?

My name is Rotarian Deinde Shoga, Past District Governor of Rotary District 9110 and Past President of the Rotary Club of Gbagada.

I Joined RC Gbagada in 1994 and Served as Chairman, various avenues of service beginning from my first six months as a member.

I eventually served as President of the club in 2000 - 01.

For the following two years, i served as Chair of District's avoidable blindness committee and then became District Secretary in 2003 - 04. I served as Assistant Governor for three years. At various times i also served as Chairman, extension committee and the Jaipur limb committee of the district among others. 35 new clubs were formed during my tenure as extension service chairman while 2 artificial limb factories were also set up under my leadership.

I served as Governor RID 9110 in 2010 - 11. As District Governor i was honoured with the RI Presidential citation award with Distinction and also won the RI President's Club Builder award in recognition of the performance of our district among other districts in the zone. That year, our district also had the highest contributions to TRF in Africa.

From 2012 - 2015 i served as the District membership Chair and also District Rotary Foundation Committee Chair (DRFC) 2017 - 20.

I was Chairman West Africa Project Fair central committee in 2016 - 17.

I am the current Regional Rotary Foundation Coordinator (RRFC) for Region 27 of zone 22.

I am a 2017 recipient of Rotary International Service Above Self award - The Highest award given to individual Rotarians for exemplary service.

In 2020, I was given the Distinguished Service Award by Alliance for Smiles Inc. USA for my efforts in supporting the provision of free cleft lip and palate surgeries for Nigerian children. I am a Rotary Foundation Alumnus.

I am a Major Donor and TRF benefactor and Member of the Bequest society.

I am a consultant Orthopaedic surgeon and lecturer in department of Surgery Lagos State University College of Medicine.

Happily married to Abimbola, a past Chairman of International Inner Wheel District 911.

We are blessed with three children. All my family members are Paul Harris Fellows.

Gbagada Express

As a Past District Governor, can you take our readers into the Rotary world?

As you will know, every year (July 1 to June 30) we have a new President who leads and motivates Rotarians for one year and then goes on to serve as Rotary senior leader in other capacities. Our current President is Jennifer Jones. The first female President. The President works with a board of 17 members and a Secretary General by the name John Hewko. The board members called Directors represent the 34 Zones of Rotary worldwide. We have over 1.4 million members in 200 countries and geographic territories. Our Rotary Clubs (over 34, 000) of them worldwide are led by Presidents who also serve for one year. Clubs in contiguous areas are aggregated into Districts under a District Governor. Our current Governor is Omotunde Lawson. Also the first female.

Rotary International has a charitable arm called The Rotary Foundation which is dedicated to our laudable aim of Doing Good in the World. The foundation funds projects worldwide as long as they conform to its seven areas of focus. One major achievement of the foundation is its success in eradicating polio from the world. The headquarters of Rotary International is in Evanston, Illinois USA. Additionally, it has 7 regional offices that also serve the districts.

PERSONALITY INTERVIEW

Gbagada Express

Rotary has monthly theme that depicts the area of focus for each month; for July it is "Transition Month"; can you enlighten Rotarians on the significance of this theme for July?

A new Rotary year begins on July 1 and ends on June 30 of the following year.

So naturally July is the month when new leaders take office worldwide. Therefore it is when the transition into a new year starts. However prior to this time, a lot of activities precede this final transition.

This begins with the International Assembly attended by all District Governor Elects for a week. At the event the RI President elect unveils his Theme for the year. The Theme for this year is Imagine Rotary. With this theme, He sets the tone for the coming year and motivates Rotarians to take action. The DGE returns to his district to train and motivate the incoming district team, the incoming Presidents and also the incoming club officers at the three different levels of training. So what we see in July is a culmination of activities that began close to six months ahead. Everything in Rotary is meticulously planned.

Leaders are elected two years ahead, so no serious leader should be caught unawares.

Gbagada Express

As a top Rotarian of many years experience, what are the metamorphosis or evolution you observe between Rotary of then and now?

Rotary is very dynamic. Always trying to reinvent itself and become better all the time. Our main engine for doing this is the Council on Legislation which meets every three years to consider proposals sent by members. Over the years, changes have taken place in respect of membership process and types. Now we have e - clubs, satellite clubs, passport clubs, cause based clubs etc. The Rotary Foundation grant models are changing as the needs demand, we have seen changes to meeting frequency which means clubs may choose not to meet every week.

Technology is serving our purposes too with the acceptance of e - meetings and hybrid meetings. With Elevate Rotaract, Rotaract members can now be Rotarians and can access Global grants, serve on Rotary committees among other innovations.

Rotary is constantly changing for good. Everyone should pay attention to these changes and stay current.

Gbagada Express

Rotary theme for August 2022 is " Membership & Extension ", what does this connote?

Membership is the lifeblood of Rotary. We are "a membership organisation that provides service" with this importance attached to the growth of Rotary through admission of new members to existing clubs and formation of new clubs (called extension) then its easy to understand how we give emphasis to this important aspect of our Rotary life by celebrating it in August. However, in essence, membership growth is not restricted to the month of August, indeed membership growth should be undertaken all year round.


