The Rotary Foundation enables Rotarians to invest in people by creating sustainable, measurable and long term economic improvements in their communities and livelihoods by :





RI PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



October 2022

In August, I was proud to visit Pakistan and highlight Rotary's top goal, eradicating polio. It was also a tremendous opportunity to spotlight female health workers who are playing a critical role in protecting children from this vaccine-preventable disease.

This month, as we celebrate World Polio Day, we are shining a spotlight on our more than 30-year effort to lead the first global polio eradication campaign and our success in forming partnerships capable of completing this massive goal. We all know that this is one of the most ambitious global health initiatives in history and that we've reduced polio cases by more than

99.9 percent worldwide.

Pakistan is one of only two countries in the world where wild poliovirus remains endemic. (The other is neighboring Afghanistan.) I was able to witness and take part in vaccination campaigns in Pakistan, and soon after I left, a monumental nationwide immunization campaign took place, focused on 43 million children under the age of 5. I saw the incredible work of Rotary members on the ground. More than 60 percent of vaccinators in Pakistan are women, and they are doing a remarkable job building trust and convincing mothers to vaccinate their children.

Seeing it all firsthand, I know that the will exists across the Rotary world to end polio, and I'm confident that we have the strategy. The Pakistani media has been very supportive of our efforts as well, and this is making a difference. This month, a new global pledging moment at the World Health Summit in Berlin promises to pull together more resources to fund these time-sensitive eradication efforts. Now it is up to us to do our part and raise \$50 million this year to earn the full 2-to-1 match from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

There's great cause for optimism on the polio front — but also some staggering new events that have further raised the stakes. Over the past few months, new polio outbreaks have occurred in Israel, the United Kingdom and, most recently, in the New York City area. These stories are frightening, but in every case, the response is clear — vaccines work, and if polio is spreading, we need to make sure the most at-risk people have kept their vaccinations up to date.

Most importantly, we need to eradicate this virus now. If polio exists anywhere, it can spread everywhere. What I saw in Pakistan convinced me that we can and must finish the job, but it will only happen if we remain committed to a strategy that's working and back it with all necessary resources.

Through our commitment, generosity, and sheer determination, we will #EndPolio.

OCTOBER AS A MONTH OF COMMUNITY ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

October as a month designated for community economic development should be so observed

by clubs and the quality of community projects executed by clubs should be remarkable.

Nearly 800 million people worldwide live on less than \$1.90 a day. Rotary members are passionate about providing sustainable solutions to poverty. Our members and our foundation work to strengthen local entrepreneurs and community leaders, particularly women, in impoverished communities. We create opportunities to help individuals and communities thrive financially and socially. Let us ask ourselves this question, 'What plans do we have as clubs for big sustainable community and life changing projects as the minutes have started counting?'

THE MONTH OF SEPTEMBER 2022

September has come and gone, though with new challenges and experiences, yet new records were set in areas of membership and Rotary Foundation. The minutes appeared to have counted faster than in previous months. The month in Rotary is designated for Basic Education and Literacy (BEL). Quite a good number of clubs executed laudable projects which included donation of reading and writing materials, read along programmes, career talk, adult literacy programmes, refurbishment of schools etc.

GOVERNOR'S VISIT TO CLUBS

Due to many other Rotary engagements, a total of thirty-six (36) clubs have been visited so far. The month of October shall be very challenging with 30 clubs to visit and on a few occasions, two clubs in a day. We shall by His grace tide over this. Be aware that the Governor's itinerary may change for different cogent reasons. What is certain is that all clubs will be accommodated as long as they are willing to receive the Governor. What clubs should understand is that the visit of the Governor is not tied to commissioning of project(s), therefore, do not shy away from accepting the proposed dates offered.

MEMBERSHIP – THE HEART-WARMING NEWS

• Membership Gain

August being Rotary's membership month was observed by clubs to induct at least a member. Worthy of note is Rotary Club of Victoria Island East, which inducted 12 new members. Our membership as of today stands at 4,838 with a net gain of 398, This figure should have been more than this but for clubs that have inducted new members and are yet to report them on Rotary Club Central. This practice is not good as it is not giving the District the correct mileage in terms of membership gain. However, it is worth mentioning that we are getting very close to meeting the minimum membership of 5,000 as provided by Rotary International for final approval of districting into 9111 and 9112 much earlier than the 30th of June, 2023 deadline. Rotary Clubs of Lagos Palmgrove Estate and Ikeja Alausa are specially recognized for adding 21 and 22 to their membership growth respectively.

• New Club Formation

An additional club chartered by Rotary International on 12th September 2022 with 25 members was Rotary Club of Olumo Sunrise,

Abeokuta which was sponsored by RC Abeokuta and has Rotn. Funmi Okusanya as the Charter President and PP Adewale Lawal as the new club adviser.

• Membership Lead for membership increase

Rotary membership lead has been successfully used as a tool for adding members. Almost all the prospects who attended the interactive hybrid session with the Governor are now in different clubs. I had the opportunity of inducting many of them in the course of my club visits. I commend clubs that sent such new members to attend the zonal multi-club training seminar held on 28th September.

• Membership Development

The second edition of the novel breakfast virtual Special Training for Action in Rotary (STAR) was held on Saturday 22nd September between 8am-9.30am. The panel discussion was on Basic Education and Literacy.

THE ROTARY FOUNDATION

Clubs and Rotarians have continued to support our Foundation. A total of \$321,000 contribution has been made so far from Annual Programs Fund, Endowment fund and PolioPlus. This excludes outstanding payments to be made for the launch of Jenifer Jones' painting and membership of PolioPlus Society by individuals and clubs. I use this medium to thank clubs and all Rotarians for rising to the call for continuous support for TRF especially PolioPlus. We cannot afford to relax on funding to eradicate completely eradicate polio.

• PolioPlus

The detection of poliovirus, and even cases of polio, in places where it hasn't been found for years has demonstrated once again that eradicating a human disease isn't easy, especially in the final stages. Rather than be discouraged, Rotary and its partners in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) remain confident that they are making progress and can achieve their goal of a polio-free world. A new oral vaccine, which has a substantially lower risk of causing vaccine-derived variant polio, is now available. "This year has shown us why we must stay the course on polio eradication," said Mike McGovern, chair of Rotary's PolioPlus Committee. "We have an opportunity to make history and need Rotarians to redouble their commitment by raising funds and awareness.

As a District and as Rotarians, we are committed to actively participate in polio immunization and increase our contributions.

World polio day as we all know is 24th October. Only 37 clubs have registered for the polio day event. What are others doing? We have a district goal of 5,000 kids to vaccinate and all clubs must engage in immunization exercise and be involved in the annual polio walk. The polio walk will be at three locations. Lagos Island, where our District Ambassador, Kunle Adeyanju will lead the walk with 50 other bikers, Rotary Centre and Abeokuta, Ogun State.

This will be hosted by District 9142 between 3rd and 5th November 2022. We expect international partners from USA, Korea and many other countries who have expressed interest in attending. A mail had already been sent to club Presidents with relevant information. Strict adherence to rules should be observed.

MORE STRATEGIC PARTNERSHIPS

- Partnership with Eko Hotels & Suites

The district is set to officially sign a corporate agreement with Eko Hotels & Suites on Tuesday 4th October 2022. This is yet another move to develop strategic partnerships with organizations for the benefit of the District and Rotarians. This partnership will provide accommodation, meals and other services to the guests of Rotary International District 9110 for prices outlined and period specified in the agreement. Details will soon be communicated to you. Similar discussions are ongoing with few other organizations. Many thanks to PAG Sanjeev Tandon, the District chair for strategic partnerships and startups committee.

- Training in emergency management for Rotarians/Rotaractors
- The District Disaster Management Committee has concluded with the Lagos State Emergency Management Agency (LASEMA) / Logic City Fleet Services Ltd to take Rotarians on 2day CPR and First aid training at a very subsidized rate of N10,000 per person. Registration for the first batch of 100 to be trained is ongoing. The district will further subsidize with 50%. Register your interest with the committee chair Mr Abayomi Bickersteth (08120693557).

ROTARY BUSINESS AND FRIENDSHIP EXCHANGE, IZMIR, TURKEY.

District Governor led other Rotarians to Turkey for Rotary Business and friendship exchange with Rotary International, District 2440, Izmir, Turkey between the 20th and 25th of September. This 5-day trip took her and the team to four cities, Istanbul, Izmir, Ankara and Adiyaman. The team visited District 2440 office where the DG signed the joint District Sister agreement. The DG flagged off the Trade Mission (Rotary Means Business) / Start-ups at the Izmir Chambers of Commerce, Ankara where the team met with investors in business opportunities. The DG also visited Nezaket Emine Atasoy, the President /CEO of ULUSKON, International Confederation of Investment and Business World, Turkey at the Ankara office. This being one of the strategic meetings planned for business and investment purposes. The exchange program was coordinated by PAG Ben Okhumale.

MELBOURNE 2023 CONVENTION 27TH-31ST MAY 2023

OCTOBER IS ECONOMIC AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT MONTH

The work of Rotary begins in the community, and every community has its own unique needs and concerns. While we serve in countless ways, we've focused our efforts in six key areas to maximize our impact. These areas encompass some of the world's most critical and widespread humanitarian needs. Rotary members planning new service projects are encouraged to consider these areas and the many opportunities for innovative projects within them. Rotary International and The Rotary Foundation have adopted six areas of focus as organizational priorities:

Peace and conflict prevention/resolution

Disease prevention and treatment

Water and sanitation

Maternal and child health

Basic education and literacy

Economic and community development

There are countless ways that Rotary clubs can address these issues both locally and internationally.

Economic and Community Development is one such area of focus that Rotary has asked all clubs to focus on , especially in October.

What is your club doing?

Here are some ideas:

190 million people are funding their business endeavors through microfinance

Partner with a local microlender to improve access to financial services and provide financial infrastructure in the community.

Develop mobile banking resources in partnership with a microlender. Cell phones, which can be used to make deposits and transfer funds, can increase access to banking systems in developing communities

When supporting service projects in a developing community, purchase goods and supplies locally to stimulate the economy and avoid unnecessary shipping fees

1.4 billion people — nearly half of them employed — live on less than \$1.25 a day

Expand vocational training opportunities, including job placement programming, at local nonprofit organizations

Send a vocational training team to teach business leaders in developing communities how to create a business plan and maintain accurate financial accounting.

Partner with a cooperative that provides training, joint economic ventures, and ownership of assets to its members through a democratic structure

Provide equipment or supplies to a cooperative to increase production and sales in the local market

Support entrepreneurs and small businesses in developing communities. The success of local business leaders can multiply employment opportunities in the community.


